

BASIC STEPS FOR APPLICATION AND ADMITTANCE TO NWCCD NURSING PROGRAM AT GILLETTE COLLEGE

- 1. Apply for general admission to NWCCD as **Health Science** major (if not already enrolled) to work on pre-requisites.
- 2. Submit official transcripts from all colleges previously attended AND high school/HSEC certificate.
- 3. Meet with Nursing Student Coordinator to review application requirements and plan.
- 4. Complete all pre-requisite courses for full points.
- 5. Meet benchmark of 2.5 cumulative GPA for pre-requisite and any co-requisite courses completed by fall semester before application date.
- 6. Complete HESI Admission Assessment (HESI A2) exam with a 75% or higher.
- Submit application for admission to the nursing program coordinator by annual deadline of March 1.

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2023-2024 NWCCD ADN Admission Requirements

ELIGIBILITY

PREREQUISITES: Prerequisites can be taken at any accredited college or university and include:

- ENGL 1010 English I (3 credit hours)
- MATH 1400 College Algebra (4 credit hours) or equivalent. Equivalent classes include MATH 1405 Trigonometry; MATH 1450 Algebra and Trigonometry, MATH 2200 Calculus I, MATH 2205 Calculus II, MATH 2210 Calculus III
- BIOL 1010 General Biology 1 (4 credits hours) or equivalent (BIOL 1000)
- **ZOO 2010** Human Anatomy & Physiology I with Lab (4 credit hours)
- Prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher prior to application to the program in order to receive points towards your application.
- Student applicants may be concurrently enrolled in up to two (2) of the four (4) pre-requisite courses and apply. Points will be awarded for the completed pre-requisite courses only, and zero (0) points will be received for the unfinished courses. If offered a seat in the program, final acceptance is contingent on successful completion of the concurrently enrolled pre-requisite course with a grade of "C" or better. Incomplete pre-requisite courses must be complete and verified by an official transcript prior to the start of the first semester of the nursing program.
- Student applicants who wish to transfer college-level credit from other schools must submit all official transcripts to the Records office. Coursework completed at another institution does not guarantee a direct equivalency at NWCCD. Once transcripts are received courses are evaluated based upon the content completed and the Registrar issues a Transfer Equivalency Report (TRER).
- Applicant must be a high school graduate or equivalent. Documentation of graduation from high school or college in the form of a valid high school diploma or higher earned degree, transcript, or other acceptable documentation confirming the applicant meets or exceeds the academic achievement equivalent to a high school diploma. Students may apply while still enrolled in their final semester of high school; however full acceptance is contingent upon receipt of documentation indicating completion.

GPA: A minimum college GPA of 2.5 is required. All completed courses applicable to the Associate Degree in Nursing will be used to compute GPA, including pre-requisites and co-requisites. All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher.



HESI ADMISSION ASSESSMENT EXAM: Applicants must take the HESI Admission Assessment (HESI A2) exam as part of the nursing program application process. The assessment must be taken prior to the March 1 application deadline and an individual total score of 75% or higher must be achieved. The HESI A2 may be repeated once (must wait 15 days between tests) between March 2 and March 1 for score improvement. Only passing scores achieved by the March 1 application deadline in the current admission cycle will be considered. The higher of the two scores is used.

NURSING APPLICATION: Submit nursing application for admission to the Gillette College or the Sheridan College Nursing Program. This is a separate application specific to the nursing program and separate from the NWCCD application.

DEADLINE: The nursing application deadline is March 1 for admission in the fall semester. Late applications and transcripts will not be reviewed. Once the application is submitted, it is the applicant's responsibility to contact the Nursing office at the college to confirm receipt.

SELECTION PROCESS

Acceptance to the program is competitive and applicants are evaluated based on a three-tier system. Each year approximately 64 students combined are selected to enter the program on the Gillette and Sheridan campuses. Applicants are ranked in order according to total points.

TIER I: Application Evaluation and Ranking

Applicants are evaluated using a point system. Points are earned in the following two areas:

- 1. **Pre-requisite points**: points are awarded for the letter grades earned in the pre-requisite classes as follows: **A or S = 4 points**, **B = 3 points**, **C = 2 points**.
- 2. **HESI A2 cumulative score**: a score of 75% or higher must be achieved for program admission eligibility.

The total pre-requisite points achieved (up to 16 points possible) are added to the highest HESI A2 score to determine overall ranking. Applicants with the highest points are offered a seat in the program.

TIER II: Seat Deposit and Conditional Acceptance

• Once offered a seat in the program, submit a signed Acceptance or Declination Form indicating intention. If accepting, a \$250.00 non-refundable deposit to hold your seat in the program is due by the annual program-designated date.



TIER III: Post Selection Requirements

Full admission is awarded upon successful completion of various requirements, which may
include but are not limited to the following: background screening, drug screen, and
documentation of the following: health examination and required immunizations, and Basic Life
Support Providers (CPR). A complete list of these requirements and instructions are provided
following notification of acceptance and receipt of the deposit. NOTE: Failure to complete the
post selection requirements by the assigned due dates will result in a rescinded admission offer
and loss of seat deposit.

BACKGROUND FINDINGS: Applicants with questions or concerns regarding future licensure based on results of the criminal background check or drug screen should contact the Wyoming State Board of Nursing at 307-777-7601. Admission to the nursing program is not a guarantee of professional licensure.

NOTIFICATION: All applicants are notified of acceptance decisions approximately 3-5 weeks after the March 1 application deadline and will either receive a letter or email of acceptance, an offer for placement on the alternate list, or a letter or email of non-acceptance. An alternate list is maintained in the event an applicant declines acceptance. Students placed on the alternate list will be notified in the order of their ranking should an opening occur in the current admission cycle.

Students who are not accepted to the program, but are interested in re-applying, must complete the nursing admission application prior to the March 1 deadline for the next admission cycle, and submit current HESI A2 scores, and official college transcripts reflecting coursework completed since the last application, if applicable.

ReNEW Nursing Curriculum

This four-semester program (after completion of the necessary prerequisites and acceptance into the program) is part of the statewide nursing curriculum Revolutionizing Nursing Education in Wyoming (ReNEW) which is designed as a baccalaureate curriculum with an ADN benchmark allowing students to sit for the NCLEX-RN (licensure exam) at the completion of the fourth semester. This curriculum allows students to complete an Associate Degree in Nursing, gain RN licensure and employment, and then transition seamlessly into the University of Wyoming for their senior year and complete a bachelor's degree.

The curriculum includes a balance of general education and nursing courses that assist students in acquiring the knowledge and skills to function as beginning practitioners of nursing. Students receive classroom instruction and coordinated clinical experience in the nursing care of patients in health care settings under the supervision and guidance of the nursing faculty. Clinical sites are in a variety of settings and travel may be required.

The nursing curriculum at Northern Wyoming Community College District (Gillette College & Sheridan College) is a leveled educational program to facilitate career mobility. The first two semesters provide a foundation for progression in the field of nursing and prepare the student to enter the second level of the nursing curriculum. At this point, after completion of the prerequisites and the first two semesters of the program, a student may choose to take the optional Practical Nursing Roles course which will give them the ability to earn a certificate and provide eligibility to take the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX-PN) and attain licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

Upon completion of the 2-year program, the graduate earns an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) and is eligible to take the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN) and attain licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN).

Prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Students are encouraged to contact the Nursing department directly for program-specific questions. Current Nursing students should refer to the respective catalog in which they began the Nursing program. Admission to the NWCCD Nursing Program is competitive and students must be in satisfactory academic standing with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher for the nursing curriculum.

Revolutionizing Nursing Education in Wyoming (ReNEW) Common Statement

More and more nurses are completing their baccalaureate degree in nursing (BSN) in order to enhance their employment opportunities, facilitate career advancement and/or prepare for graduate education. ReNEW is a shared statewide curriculum providing a streamlined bridge from the associate degree in nursing to the BSN.



- The ReNEW program plan is a four-year, eight semester baccalaureate curriculum.
- You can start at one of the Wyoming community colleges and be dually enrolled at the University of Wyoming.
- Upon successful completion of the five-semester ADN benchmark, you are awarded an associate degree in nursing. Upon completion of the eight semesters, the BSN degree is awarded.
- The courses/clinical experiences needed to complete the BSN in year four are available through the university online so you do not have to leave home.
- NWCCD began the ReNEW curriculum August 2018.

SEPARATE 4 CREDIT ANATOMY AND 4 CREDIT PHYSIOLOGY CLASSES:

- Classes must be from an accredited college. It is highly recommended that the student verify with the NWCCD Records Department that their chosen class will transfer in to NWCCD officially.
- Students are eligible to apply with ONLY one of the 4 credit (with a lab) Anatomy OR Physiology class completed.
- Students are awarded the points appropriate to the letter grade achieved in the class completed.
- Students must show proof of registration for the other 4 credit class in the spring, and complete it successfully by the end of the semester.
- Official transcript showing successful completion of the second class must be received by NWCCD no later than May 31.
- Successful completion with a 'C' or better of both of these classes fulfills NWCCD's nursing program pre-requisite of ZOO 2010 Anatomy and Physiology I, and the program's co-requisite of ZOO 2020 Anatomy & Physiology II.
- Once committed to the 4 credit Anatomy or Physiology class, the student must complete the other 4 credit class.

NOTICE OF NWCCD NURSING PROGRAM PRE-REQUISITE CHANGES

The following changes became effective March 2, 2019:

- STAT 2050 Fundamentals of Statistics or STAT 2070 Introduction to Statistics for Social Science are **not** an equivalent substitute for the NWCCD nursing program math pre-requisite.
- STAT 2050 Fundamentals of Statistics or STAT 2070 Introduction to Statistics for Social Science will not be accepted as a math equivalent for the spring 2020 application cycle.



• GPA: A minimum college GPA of 2.5 is required. All completed courses applicable to the Associate Degree in Nursing will be used to compute GPA, including pre-requisites and co-requisites. All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher.

HESI ADMISSION ASSESSMENT (A2) EXAM FAQs

The HESI A2 Exam is an admission requirement for all applicants to NWCCD-Gillette College/Sheridan College Nursing Program.

What is the HESI Admission Assessment (A2) Exam?

The HESI Admission Assessment, or HESI A2, is a computerized exam developed by Elsevier designed to assess the academic and personal readiness of prospective students for higher education. Learn more about the <u>HESI A2 exam on Elsevier's web site</u>. Elsevier publishes review materials for this exam that may be purchased directly through <u>Elsevier</u> or through your local bookstore.

The HESI A2 Exam consists of five academic exams, a critical thinking assessment, and a profile that identifies the applicant's learning and personality style. Test takers will take all program required sections of the HESI A2 in a single testing session. All applicants are required to complete the HESI A2 Exam by March 1st to be considered for acceptance into the Nursing Program.

Students will be permitted short breaks if needed. Registering for the test will take about 30 minutes. Total time allotted to complete the exam is 6 hours. Students may be allowed longer testing time with ADA accommodations.

Where can I take the HESI A2 exam?

Online, in your school's secure computerized testing center. Please contact the testing center for further details:

What does the HESI A2 cost?

The exam is \$60.00, which must be paid when making your testing appointment, and is nonrefundable. You must show proof of payment when you arrive to take the exam. If you have to reschedule you must call 24 hours before your appointment, or the fee is forfeited.

What should I bring with me?

Bring only photo identification and receipt for payment of the exam to the testing center. Testing supplies will be issued, including paper and pencil. A basic calculator is provided within the online test. Do not bring any personal items to the test.



How should I prepare?

Elsevier publishes review materials for this exam that may be purchased directly through <u>Elsevier</u> or through your local bookstore. In addition, the study booklet, *Admission Assessment Exam Review* (Elsevier Health Services), may be available for check out at the college library.

NOTE: Biology, physics and chemistry will not be included in testing. The costs of the test and study materials are the responsibility of the applicant. Visit <u>http://www.hesi-exam.com/hesi-a2-entrance-exam/</u> for further information and study materials.

What is tested?

- English Language
 - Exam 1 Reading Comprehension: Provides scenarios in order to measure reading comprehension, including identifying the main idea, finding meaning of words in context, and making logical inferences. 50 items
 - **Exam 2 Vocabulary & General Knowledge**: Tests knowledge of everyday vocabulary terms, as well as vocabulary used in healthcare fields. 50 items
 - Exam 3 Grammar: Assesses knowledge of basic grammar, including parts of speech, important terms and their uses in grammar, commonly occurring grammatical errors and more. 50 items
- Math
 - **Exam 4 Basic Math Skills:** Focuses on math skills needed for healthcare fields, including basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, fractions, decimals, ratio and proportion, household measures and general math facts. 50 items
- Science
 - Exam 5 Anatomy & Physiology: Provides coverage of general terminology and anatomical structures and systems. (NOTE: NWCCD GC/SC do not test the sections of Chemistry, Physics or Biology) 25 items

Critical Thinking—the following is required, but is not used in determining your score.

A total score is reflective of abilities in four categories:

- Problem Solving—refers to the process of inquiry in which the nurse seeks multiple facts to remove obstacles or resolve patient care problems.
- Biases and Ethical Dilemmas—addresses ethical, legal, and moral issues, as well as biases nurses may have about patients and others.
- Argument Analysis—refers to situations in which the nurse seeks to resolve conflicts or disagreements by considering multiple points of view.
- Analysis of Data—addresses the need to interpret patient data correctly, and decide if further nursing action is required.

This exam is intended to provide a brief "snapshot" of critical thinking ability in situations encountered in healthcare settings. The nursing program will use this initial exam to establish a baseline which will be compared with a similar assessment at the end of the program. 25 items



Personality Profile—the following are required, but are not used in determining your score.

- **Personality Profile:** Uses concepts related to introversion and extroversion to classify the student's personality style. 15 items
- Learning Style: Assesses the preferred learning style of the prospective applicant and offers test-taking and study tips suited for that learning style. 14 items

What is the passing score?

Your HESI A2 cumulative score will be used for ranking. In order to meet eligibility requirements to apply to the Nursing Program students must achieve an overall cumulative score of 75% on the exam.

Admission to the Nursing Program is highly competitive and is not guaranteed even if you meet a grade or test score criteria. Each applicant is evaluated on the strength of the credentials presented and judged against equally strong applicants. The higher your score, the stronger your application becomes.

Official scores will be obtained from Elsevier directly by the NWCCD Nursing Program. Score results must be within the 12 month period up until the posted deadline—March 1st each year. Score results after this deadline will be considered for the next year's admission cycle.

What if I don't pass the HESI A2 the first time?

Students have the option to retake the test one time within a 12-month timeframe. Students will retest with a different version of the exam— no student will have the same exam items twice. When retaking the test, students will have to retake all required sections of the test. The HESI entrance exam scores must be less than one year old from the March 1 deadline of the current year.

Students may retake the HESI Admission Assessment (A2) Exam only after a 15-day waiting period between attempts. Scores from tests taken in violation of the 15-day rule are invalid. The Nursing Program will use the highest score to determine eligibility and ranking for acceptance.




