## [Campbell County Farm Bureau Scholarship](#)

1. Applicant or applicant's family must be a current regular or associate member of the Campbell County Farm Bureau Federation.
2. Applicant must either have a High School Diploma, GED or be in the current graduating class.
3. Applicant must have at least a 3.0 scholastic grade point average based upon a 4.0 scale.
4. Applicant must be enrolled at a Wyoming Junior College, the University of Wyoming, or at a Wyoming technical school at the time the scholarship funds are granted.

#### **Eligibility, Application, and Selection Process:**

- Available to graduates and graduating seniors planning to attend college the following fall.
- Full-time Enrollment into a diesel technician program will be required.
- Scholarship recipients must maintain a grade point average required to remain in good standing in the school in which they are enrolled.
- High school applicants are required to attach a copy of their official ACT/SAT scores and their current high school transcript to the online application
- The scholarship will be rescinded and awarded to a designated alternate if the recipient does not enroll as a full-time student for the first semester for which the scholarship is awarded.

Applicants must provide a short essay relating to goals, training path or plan, future employment interests and 3 letters of recommendation.

Online applications must be submitted to the Oregon Trail Community Foundation by April 1st. All applications will be reviewed by the OTCF Scholarship Committee, with the finalists forwarded on to the Floyd's Truck Center, Inc. Scholarship Committee.

The deadline for application and supporting documents is April 1st. Recipients will be announced in May.

To be eligible, students, parents, and/or guardian must be a member in good standing of WSGA. The applicants must be a sophomore, junior, or senior for the upcoming Fall semester, or a senior who is graduating and has been accepted into graduate school for the concurrent semester. The students must be enrolled full-time at the University of Wyoming or a Wyoming Community College, have a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher, and be majoring in agriculture or a natural resource related field. The winners will be approved by the WSGA trustees based on recommendation from the WSGA Executive Committee. The scholarship winners will be announced at the Wyoming Cattle Industry Convention & Trade Show. Winners will be notified prior and invited to attend to be recognized in front of WSGA membership and supporters.

The Hawthorn Foundation administers a **Scholarship Fund** that provides grants to Wyoming individuals to enable them to complete a high school, undergraduate, graduate or technical school education in the field of their choice at any accredited school they may choose that is in the United States.

To be eligible for a scholarship, applicants must reside in Wyoming and plan to attend on a full-time basis a fully accredited educational institution in the United States. Applicants must submit with their application: (i) a detailed plan outlining how they propose to use scholarship funds, including the name of the educational institution they wish to attend, the tuition, fees and other expenses that would be required for attendance, the duration and location of the program, and the degree or certification they hope to obtain (an "Education Plan"); and (ii) a description of how pursuing the contemplated course of study would improve his or her life circumstances (a "Personal Essay").

### *Rocky Mountain Master mechanic: Ernest Swinny Master Mechanic scholarship*

#### *The “Ernest Swinney Master Mechanic Scholarship”*

Offered to those individuals who are 18 years of age or older, have graduated or will graduate from an accredited high school, and possess adequate practical experience and /or formal training to meet institutional prerequisites and demonstrate sincerity.

This award may be used at any nationally accredited institution that is offering a degree or diploma in mining related technical, maintenance or field mechanics.

The recipient of this award will be required to verify their pursuit in mining related technical, maintenance, or field mechanics. Maintain no less than a 2.0 on a 4.0 scale or C grade average. Scholastic standing to be reported to committee chairperson on a semesterly basis and conform to the governing rules and regulations of the institution. Noncompliance to any or all of the above requirements will constitute loss of future awards.

### *Rocky Mountain Mining Institute*

- Engineering/Geology Scholarship

Given to students at a four-year school. Students must be a U.S. citizen, a resident of one of the RMMI member states, and looking for a career in the mining industry. The selected students are also offered an all-expense paid trip to the RMMI Annual Meeting and Conference in late June, where they have the opportunity to meet industry leaders and attend all of the technical sessions.

- Technical Scholarship

This program started in 2007, the Technical Scholarship is a one-time, \$1,000 gift to students in technical programs who hope to take their education into the mining industry, where there is a great demand for technical applications.

1. Scholarship applicants must be graduates of a Wyoming high school or hold a Wyoming GED.
2. The recipients must be full-time students during the year the scholarship is used. Completion of a full course load with a minimum GPA of 2.5 is required for the first semester in order to receive the scholarship the second (spring) semester.

### **Eligibility Overview**

These are some general requirements to keep in mind when applying for National Scholarships:

- Two letters of recommendations are required.

- Applicant must have an official transcript set my email or mail directly from the school or third-party transcript provider.
- Some National Scholarships require demonstrated financial need, which means the cost of attendance exceeds the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as found on the FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR). The SAR must be submitted in addition to cost of attendance documentation to be eligible for these scholarships.
- Some scholarships require or have a preference for applicants to be a member of AWS. To apply for an AWS student membership, please visit the [Student Membership page](#).
- Students who are currently enrolled in vocational schools, technical colleges, community colleges, or universities should apply if they meet the needed criteria.
